They wanted the town to prohibit any gas drilling and Hydrofracting in the Town of Holland. Their property was left in shambles, area around the wells were not finished off. Open pits and the water leaked out and ruined the farmable land. They said it wasn't worth the money for the damage that was done to their property. They submitted to the Town copies of a letter from NYS Agriculture and Markets to Us Energy Development Corporation. The letter was to document and summarize a November 13, 2009 site visit conducted by NYS Ag & Markets staff and to provide technical recommendations for effective agricultural restoration at the Keem Farm. Also in this letter were photos of the Keem Property.
