Anticipated insurance increase of 15% but the preliminary indication is somewhere of 30% increase. Public hearing was closed at 8:05 pm.

AMBULANCE RE-ORGANIZATION

Going to Waverly, NY to see how they set up their service. Long term – remove the Town of Holland Town Board from management of the ambulance, would go to the Fire Company. Gives them the ability to go to Third party billing and insurance billing.

DRAINAGE

Hillcrest Drive – more of a problem than initially thought. Have the Attorney notify owners of the property of the problem and do some remedial work.

North Main St. – Upstate Ford – proceeding to do some diversionary work to alleviate the flooding problem.

Councilman Hack – some of these issues have been around awhile concerning North Main St. – is there some kind of drainage code etc. Attorney Bennett stated there are site plan approvals etc.

Buildings – Councilman Britt – Steve’s Services is working on the heating system. Supervisor would like the grant writer to look into a grant for new windows.

Planning Board – Councilwoman Kline – approval for special use permits for Mr. Winter and also Mike & Julie Smith

Town Park and Community Center – Councilman Hack – restroom should be finished in a couple weeks. Cages for storage still don’t have the latches on – will pursue legal matters with the vendor.

New parking area – will continue to use as is until spring when more work will be done.

Environmental Committee – Councilman Britt – Kathy Konst is the new commissioner.

Beautification – Councilwoman Herr: will be planting tulip bulbs. Flower boxes will be put away etc.

Cemetery – Councilman Hack: stone work to be done and some dead trees to be removed. Councilman Hack asked the Attorney a question about the perpetual care account – if that money had to stay in that account. Attorney said yes.

ZONING ENFORCEMENT OFFICER’S REPORT – Michael Sluce: report given. Storage sheds are being built without building permits – each municipality has different rules so everyone needs to check with the building officer.

BUILDING OFFICER’S REPORT – Scott Hess: report given.

RESOLUTION #99

Motion made by Councilman Hack and seconded by Councilwoman Kline, resolve the Town of Holland close the regular meeting at 8:30 pm to open the public hearing. ALL AYES. CARRIED.

8:30 pm PUBLIC HEARING – for the purpose of reviewing the Community Development Block Grant Program for 2010, a formalized program that comes from the federal government through a consortium of towns in southern Erie county administered by Erie County. This year the criteria is no more than \$100,000. Last year and the year before the town did not qualify. Traditionally this Town Board has supported Rural Transit and the Supervisor suggests that the town submit application for the full \$100,000 - \$8000 for the Rural Transit and \$92,000 for the project to bring the second water well within the hamlet on line in the water district. Community Development Block Grant funds can only be used for low and moderate income. Hamlet is the only part that qualifies. This time the Supervisor called for any comments. Councilman Hack noted that the Water should be listed first and then Rural Transit second. Councilman Britt asked with this new water well could the district be enlarged. Water Commissioner stated yes. The health department is requiring a second source of water in the event something was to happen to the other well. Right now we have to run power to it, run pipe, add chlorination unit and etc. Hearing no more comments the Supervisor declared the public hearing closed at 8:35 pm.

8:35 Pm – Regular Meeting resumed.

HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT’S REPORT – Pat Joyce: having a problem with commercial companies and neighboring towns dropping off tires. The town is in excess of 10,000 tires that they have taken in. Supervisor stated that the Town implemented a program for town residents to drop off tires at the Highway Garage for them to be disposed of properly so they weren’t spread along the roadside. Supervisor is asking the Town Attorney to draft an ordinance that says basically residents only and that a penalty should be built in if not a resident.

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Disaster Co-coordinator – swine flu shots are coming available – Erie County is looking for point of distribution and right now they are leaning toward using the schools.

New truck should be ready in a couple weeks.

- Building is 16' x 22'.
- Business will be kitchen and bath showroom and office space; had similar showroom in Yorkshire not too long ago.
- Will lease building; possibly purchase contingent on how well business progresses.
- Currently has established construction business out of West Valley. Mainly kitchen/bath remodeling, siding, additions, pole barns, garages.
- May hire employee for showroom/office help.
- Plans to be open six days per week (MWF, 9am-5pm; TTH, 9am-8pm; Sat, 9am-2pm).
